





# Kalakbay: An Apostolate on Co-journeying and Accompaniment

The Kalakbay program of the Immaculate Conception Cathedral in the Diocese of Cubao takes a different approach to vocation of assisting the faithful, especially the youth, in providing direction and discernment through accompaniment. Instead of a "hardsell" approach of entering the seminary or convent, Kalakbay, meaning "co-journeyer," encourages the faithful, especially the youth, to discern God's universal call to holiness in various states of life, including priesthood, religious life, marriage, and single blessedness.



After being paused due to the pandemic, the program resumed in June, starting with a "kumustahan" session facilitated by seminarians from the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament (SSS). Sessions on the universal call to holiness and various vocations followed, led by the Daughters of St. Anne (DSA) and La Salette Missionaries. The program also launched YouR Encounter (Youth and Religious Encounter), which brings together religious congregations, married couples, and singles to share their vocation experiences.

Now preparing for its fifth session in October and a vocation fair in November, Kalakbay has brought together more than 100 active participants in just a short span of time. Kalakbay is gearing up to widen and deepen its reach to help the faithful find their true vocation, which undeniably springs forth joy and deeper communion with Christ.
